Purpose:

To clarify the type of work that can be done by a Home Improvement Contractor

Question 1:

What is the definition of structural?

Answer:

Structural refers to the elements and systems that are essential for the vertical and lateral stability of a building, ensuring it can safely support loads and resist

external forces to include bearing walls.

Question 2:

Can a Home Improvement Contractor engage in 'structural' work associated with the

alteration of a door, window or wall?

Answer:

No. Structural alterations are only allowed by Residential Building Contractors.

Question 3:

What is the definition of work and building area as it relates to the 50% rule?

Answer:

The work area is defined in the scope of work submitted with the permit application. The building area is defined as the sum of all floor areas within the exterior walls. Home Improvement Contractors cannot make renovations or

alterations that exceed 50% of the 'building area'.
